#### **Reading for our Celebration Christening**

#### **Luke 8:1-15 New International Version**

8 After this, Jesus travelled about from one town and village to another, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom of God. The Twelve were with him, <sup>2</sup> and also some women who had been cured of evil spirits and diseases:

Mary (called Magdalene) from whom seven demons had come out; <sup>3</sup> Joanna the wife of Chuza, the manager of Herod's household; Susanna; and many others. These women were helping to support them out of their own means. <sup>4</sup> While a large crowd was gathering and people were coming to Jesus from town after town, he told this parable: <sup>5</sup> "A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path; it was trampled on, and the birds ate it up. <sup>6</sup> Some fell on rocky ground, and when it came up, the plants withered because they had no moisture. <sup>7</sup> Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up with it and choked the plants. <sup>8</sup> Still other seed fell on good soil. It came up and yielded a crop, a hundred times more than was sown." When he said this, he called out, "Whoever has ears to hear, let them hear." <sup>9</sup> His disciples asked him what this parable meant. <sup>10</sup> He said, "The knowledge of the secrets of the kingdom of God has been given to you, but to others I speak in parables, so that,

"though seeing, they may not see;

though hearing, they may not understand.'[a]

<sup>11</sup> "This is the meaning of the parable: The seed is the word of God. <sup>12</sup> Those along the path are the ones who hear, and then the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts, so that they may not believe and be saved. <sup>13</sup> Those on the rocky ground are the ones who receive the word with joy when they hear it, but they have no root. They believe for a while, but in the time of testing they fall away. <sup>14</sup> The seed that fell among thorns stands for those who hear, but as they go on their way they are choked by life's worries, riches and pleasures, and they do not mature. <sup>15</sup> But the seed on good soil stands for those with a noble and good heart, who hear the word, retain it, and by persevering produce a crop.

Almighty God, you show to those who are in error the light of your truth, that they may return to the way of righteousness: grant to all those who are admitted into the fellowship of Christ's religion, that they may reject those things that are contrary to their profession, and follow all such things as are agreeable to the same; through our Lord Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

## Opening Meeting re the Proposed Reorganisation of Anglican Churches in Macclesfield

Over the last year or so, there has been a lot of work going on behind the scenes considering various ways in which we might strengthen the Anglican Church in Macclesfield.

There are 9 churches in the town and the following proposal, which aims to utilise available resources more effectively, has been put forward. The town's churches would be reorganised into 4 parishes, each with a specific focus:

- 1. St Michael's Rev Martin Stephens Civic Church
- 2. Holy Trinity Hurdsfield Rev. James Gibson Family Worship
- 3. St John's, the Church of the Resurrection (Upton Priory) and St Barnabas vicar to be appointed focus on estates' ministry
- 4. St Thomas', All Saints and St Peter's vicar to be appointed focus on traditional worship and pastoral care

There will be an Open Meeting at St Thomas' Parish Hall (Church Lane Henbury SK11 9NN) on Thursday April 10<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m. to discuss these proposals and ask questions. The PCC members at St Thomas' will then vote on this proposal.

All are welcome to attend the meeting, although only members of the PCC will be eligible to vote.

#### **Henbury Council Tax**

Residents of Henbury will have received their Council Tax notice for 2025/26 recently. Cheshire East Council are facing severe financial challenges that have been widely reported in the media. The Government have recently stepped in offering financial assistance of £25.3 million for the coming year to ensure a balanced budget. A further £17.3m has been provided for the current

year to the council to avoid a section 114 notice when a council is unable to meet its obligations.

Henbury Parish Council have a good working dialogue with Cheshire East officers. It is evident that due to the pressures the council faces, cuts to services that residents would normally expect to be provided by CEC are no longer available. In some circumstances the Parish Council has taken over the funding of services or introduced services for the benefit of the community. Henbury Parish Council set the precept before the Government announced it would step in to help CEC and certain assumptions were made from local sources as to the further cuts we would face to services such as bin collection, weeding of roads and footpaths.

Recent and ongoing examples of Henbury Parish Council support are

- Winter Gritting and ploughing of major roads
- Upgrade and Maintenance of local footpaths
- · Removal and pruning of trees impacting the highway
- · Cutting back hedgerows on footpaths.
- · Increased funding to the Millennium Green Trust
- · Village maintenance of public areas
- · Autumn leaf removal
- Lower Car park waste bin provision
- Bus shelter maintenance
- Community planting schemes throughout Henbury
- Largest ever community fibre broadband scheme in the uk to date that took councillors over three years and many hundreds of hours work with over £342,000 of works carried out at no cost to the community.
- In addition, the council have successfully managed to have siding works carried out on the footpath between Pepper Street and Rough Heys lane.
- Recent water supply disruptions are finally being addressed by United Utilities after several months of ongoing dialogue
- The Parish Council continue to address the unacceptable flooding issues on Church Lane by the sub station.

The Parish Council are in receipt of section S106 monies due to recent housing developments within the parish. Consequently, the Parish Council have sought to increase the precept for 2025/26 so that working in conjunction with Cheshire East Council we may address the state of certain infrastructure elements such as pavements and footpaths that are long overdue attention. If we do not use the significant funds allocated to the Parish Council within a five year window then all monies have to be returned to the developer. It is for this reason that councillors unanimously agreed to have a larger increase in the precept to assist with the funding.

The parish Council reduced the precept by 12.8% last year to maintain a balanced budget.

It should be noted that the following precept levels have applied in Henbury to a Band F property in recent years.

Year Amount Increase/Decrease 2020/21 £76.97 n/a 2021/22 £88.98 15.6% 2022/23 £91.53 2.9% 2023/24 £90.25 -1.4% 2024/25 £78.68 -12.8%

The precept for an F property is now £102.14 a 29% increase however compared to 2022/23 this is an 11% increase.
